## NEWS

Happy New Year to everybody and welcome back to the world of funding news!

Funds to watch out for this year include the second tranche of the Big Local Trust areas which will follow once the trustee for the local trust has been set up. The Coastal Communities Fund which is a new fund designed to support the economic development of coastal communities and will target projects that support charities, the environment, education and health. The Green Deal framework will be launched from October 2012 and will enable many households and businesses to improve the energy efficiency of their properties. The Green Deal will introduce a new finance mechanism enabling the cost of energy efficiency measures installed to be paid back via the energy bill. Local Authorities are expected to play a vital role in the roll out of this scheme.

### • European

- Congratulations to Southampton City Council's flagship project GRaBS (Green & Blue Space Adaption for Urban Areas & Eco-Towns) for being shortlisted for an EU Regio Stars Award under the category 'Sustainable Growth : Eco-System Services. The project is a network of leading organisations across Europe involved in integrating climate change adaptation into urban planning and development; including green infrastructure such gardens, parks, productive landscapes, green corridors, green roofs and walls; and blue infrastructure such as water bodies, rivers, streams, floodplains and sustainable drainage systems. Winners will be announced on 16<sup>th</sup> January.
- As reported in the last edition of FF, the EU has adopted a draft legislative package that will frame EU Cohesion Policy for the period 2014-2020. As a result proposals for new programmes of work are now emerging, including a new LIFE Programme for the Environment and Climate Action worth €3.2bn. Briefly, the programme aims to build on the success of the existing LIFE+ Programme but with greater impact and more flexibility. Key themes include the creation a new sub-programmes for Climate Action (climate change, mitigation & adaption) and Environment (resource efficiency, bio-diversity, governance & information). - **DWP £200 million European Social Fund Provision for Families with Complex Needs** DWP will officially launch the provision in January 2012. It is delivered through its Framework providers across twelve Contract Package Areas. Contracts have gone live across the country during December. Councils have no contractual arrangements but will refer these families on to providers in their CPA to access provision. Providers will work closely with councils on referrals, and update progress on a monthly basis. Intervention for every referral will be over twelve months only. - **Building Capabilities for Impact and Legacy discussion paper**

Big is publishing a discussion paper around BLF's plans for funding of support services for voluntary organisations. This is called 'Building Capabilities for Impact and Legacy' This discussion paper sets out the principles which will inform BLF's approach and give interested organisations (including both infrastructure and frontline voluntary organisations) the chance to inform BLF's thinking as they decide how best to implement these principles and take a long term view of what to invest in, based on supporting organisations and activities that combat fuel poverty and deprivation. Summary	<p>The previously delayed Call for the Daphne Programme has finally been announced with a total budget of €25.8m. The programme supports projects that aim to combat and prevent violence against children, young people and women, and to protect victims and groups at risk. <p>Summary</p>	<p>The fund supports businesses in the UK to develop their skills solutions tailored to their own needs, transforming growth in their sector, region or supply chain.</p> <p>There are no minimum or maximum funding levels cited for individual projects. However, the selection criteria include looking at the scale and impact of proposals and how well proposed solutions meet priority needs identified by bidders in their sectoral analysis of what can unlock growth potential. For that reason, applications with a very small value will not generally be accepted. BIS expects most successful proposals to be on a relatively large scale requiring investment greater than £500K per annum over a period of approximately two years.</p> <p>GIF is able to invest in a wide variety of ideas and is actively seeking proposals that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• deliver demonstrably employer-led, innovative and future-proofed skills solutions;</li> <li>• support the drive to greater ownership of skills by employers;</li> <li>• use GIF investment alongside employer investment; and</li> <li>• build sustainable skills capacity and infrastructure.</li> </ul>

<p>Who can apply</p>	<p>All LEPs that have been asked to put their boards in place by Ministers are eligible.</p>

<p>Summary</p>	<p>The Fund now has a broad objective of supporting LEPs to address the issues that will best help them deliver local growth. In order to simplify the programme, BIS has advised that there will be no bidding process for this round. However, to ensure compatibility with government finance rules, LEPs will be required to give some indication of how they intend to use their allocation before a formal grant offer is made. Funding can be used to support a range of activities, including the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Analysis of existing economic data or intelligence to help LEPs prioritise the activities to engage in.</li> <li>• Analysis of new or emerging industries or clusters.</li> <li>• Analysis of potential barriers and collection of new economic data. This may include analysis of data that already exists on a local authority level, on an LEP level.</li> <li>• Training for board members.</li> </ul>

Summary	<p>The aim of the Fund is to encourage bus operators and local authorities in every region to invest in low carbon technology and hasten the introduction of low carbon public transport.</p> <p>Funding from the Green Bus Fund round 3 can only be used to help meet the upfront cost of buying one or more new low carbon emission buses. It cannot be used to meet outstanding payments for buses already ordered or bought. But it can be used to turn an existing order for standard buses into an order for low carbon emission buses. Successful bidders will need to place orders with manufacturers for low carbon emission buses by end March 2012. All buses must come into service by 31 March 2013</p>
Funding	Total budget of £20m. Each bidder is restricted to a maximum total grant of £5 million.

Bids, for example, might relate to particular bus routes that run across more than one authority
Funding	£50m is available to fund a minimum of 10 local authorities. Applications for up to £5m will be considered. Funding is available for revenue or capital or a mix of both. However in aggregate the split between revenue and capital is expected to be of the order of 50:50.
