<p>Child Abuse Investigation Team Tuesday 26th September 12.00 – 2.00pm Conference Room 4</p>	<p>This workshop run by Louise Mills from Hampshire Constabulary's Child Abuse Investigation Team will cover the Police response to child abuse, how child abuse is investigated and the expectations around reporting, including Sexting.</p>
<p>Recognising Physical Abuse Wednesday 4th October 2017 12.00 – 1.30pm Committee Room 1</p>	<p>Dr Hilary Smith, Designated Doctor for Southampton City CCG, will run this session which will present information about injuries in children and the evidence base for distinguishing accident from abuse.</p>
<p>CSE and BAME communities Monday 9th October 2017 1.30 – 3.30pm Conference Room 3</p>	<p>This workshop run by Sukhdev Rathore from Barnardos will focus on the issues of working with young people and their families at risk of child sexual exploitation from Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic Communities, their additional vulnerabilities to CSE, overcoming barriers to engagement and providing solution focused interventions.</p>

<p>Focus on Fraud / Financial Exploitation Wednesday 22nd November 2017 12.00 – 2.00pm Council Chamber</p>	<p>This workshop run by Lesley Donnison, Senior Fair Trading Officer, will cover financial abuse as a result of mass marketing fraud perpetrated by fraudsters via telephone, mail, internet and doorstep. It will also cover:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to spot financial abuse • Reporting it • The impact upon the victim • The support offered to victims by the Trading Standards service and • A brief outline of the work being carried out internationally to combat this crime.
<p>Youth Justice Wednesday 29th November 2017 12.00 – 2.00pm Conference Room 3</p> 	<p>Jon Gardner, Youth Offending Service (YOS) Manager and Katie Patterson Assistant Team Manager will run this workshop which will provide an overview of the function of the Youth Offending Service and details of the statutory and non-statutory work undertaken in the city to prevent offending and intervene with those children who come into contact with the Youth Justice System including an oversight of restorative practices. The workshop will also look at the implications of the Taylor Review into Youth Justice for partners and agencies working in the city. Finally, the workshop will focus upon County Lines and how work is undertaken cross border with other local authorities to address the problems caused by transient young people entering the city to offend</p>
<p>How to work with Interpreters Wednesday 6th December 2017 12.00 – 2.00pm Conference Room 4</p> 	<p>“How to work with interpreters” is designed to give tips on streamlining communication with clients using interpreters and highlight key issues of working with clients who come from a different culture. Alex Hales, the facilitator, is an experienced health and social care interpreter and translator working with health and social services in the Southampton area.</p>
<p>Mental Capacity Act 2005 Wednesday 13th December 2017 12.00 – 2.00pm Council Chamber</p> 	<p>Emma Berry, DoLS Team Manager will run this workshop which will explore the principles of the Mental Capacity Act 2005, how these apply in practice, who they apply to and will aim to equip all professionals with the basic skills to complete a Mental Capacity Assessment. The session will then briefly explore case studies and the integral role of the Mental Capacity Act in guiding decision making. Delegates are not required to have any previous experience of the Mental Capacity Act however more experienced practitioners and their reflections are always welcome. The Mental Capacity Act applies to all persons from the age of 16 years and as such those working within Children’s Services or with the Transitions Group are especially welcome.</p>
<p>Hampshire Liaison and Diversion Service Wednesday 21st February 2018 1.00 – 3.00pm Committee Room 1</p> 	<p>Abi Benussi of the Hampshire Liaison and Diversion Service will be running a workshop to explain the support available to vulnerable adults who find themselves in the Criminal Justice System. Appropriate for anyone who works with families where there is offending and vulnerability; including mental health, learning disabilities and autism.</p>
