

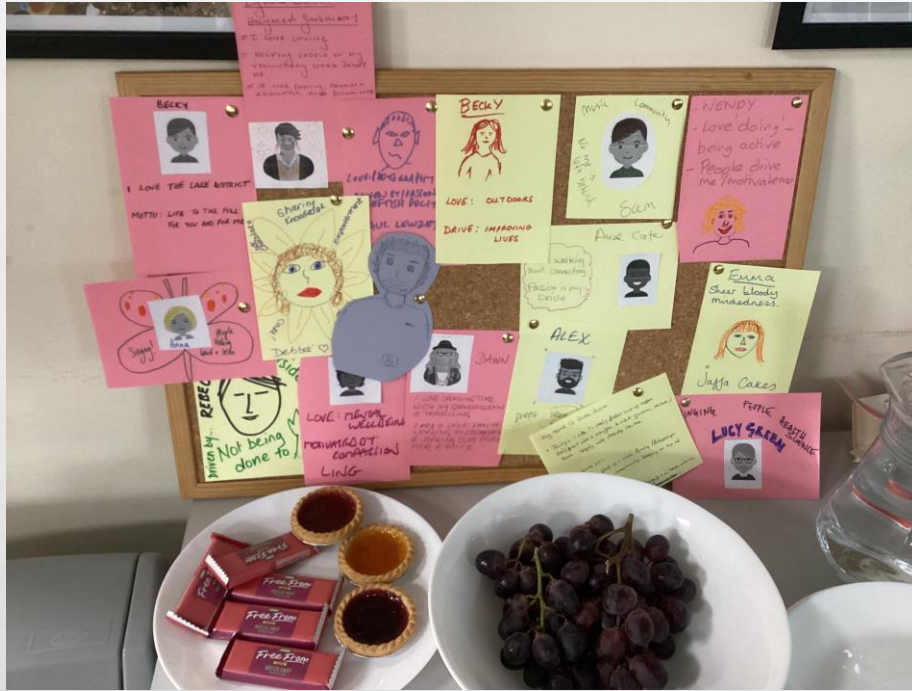

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Coproduction yes, but what does it mean?



Coproduction often used interchangeably with “consultation” or “community involvement.”

Coproduction goes a step further, working together as equals:

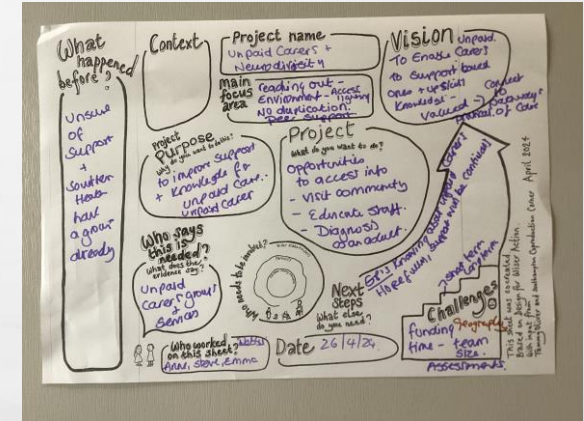
- Local people are involved in designing and delivering a project, service, or initiative.
- People with “lived experience” are making decisions.
- It fulfils the objective of “nothing about us without us.”
- It makes people feel valued rather than “done to.”

• STEP ONE

- Ensuring those impacted by the issues explored are at the heart of conversations and decision-making
- Link with community organisations
- Monty's / Veracity life = teenage girls in parks
- Board in the city = trauma and access to services

STEP TWO

- Coproduction corner = stakeholder conversations, including those with lived experience

STEP THREE

- Policy review and make change happen
